NO HINDRANCE TO APAPA AND TIN CAN PORTS OPERATIONS

The MD added that while a lot of attention had been on Maritime space, there is complete neglect of the intermodal linkages such as no train connectivity at Lekki Port, even the road connectivity is grossly in-adequate.

Speaking in Lagos recently, in his paper titled "Lekki Deepsea: Gains, Challenges and Potential Threat to Lagos Ports" at a Retreat Organized by the leadership of the League of Maritime Editors in Lagos, Bello koko asserted that the seeming neglect of hinterland connectivity at the Lekki Port is likely to be a major problem for the optimisation of the benefits of the project investment and the efficiency of the Port operations.





You shock me to awe as you send soldiers to suicide over juicy pots of black gold and run amok after silhouette.


America, you shock me to awe, roam the globe for stinks, yet stench oozes from your bedroom feed and cloth umbrella body who is sacred, snores at your tantrums.

LAW OF THE FEDERATION OF NIGERIA (FOI ACT)

ubstantive rules of the institution

Statements and interpretations of policy which have been adopted by the institution, Final planning policies, recommendations, and decisions;

Factual reports, inspection reports, and studies whether prepared by or for the institution;

Information relating to the receipt or expenditure of public or other funds of the institution;

The names, salaries, titles and dates of employment of all employees and officers of the institution;

The right of the state, public institutions, or of any private persons(s)

The name of every official and the final records of voting in all proceedings of the institution;

(e) a list of –

Files containing applications for any contract, permit, grants licenses and agreements,

Reports, documents, studies, or publications prepared by independent contractors for the institution, and

Materials containing information relating to any grant or contract made by or between the institution and another public institution or private organization;

- (f) the title and address of the appropriate officer of the institution to whom an application for information under this Act shall be sent, provided that the failure of any public institution to publish any information under this subsection shall not prejudicially affect the public's right of access to information in the custody of such public institution.
- (4) A public institution shall ensure that information referred to in this section is widely disseminated and made readily available to members of the public through various means, including print, electronic and online sources, and at the offices of such

public institutions.

- (5) A public institution shall update and review information required to be published under this section periodically, and immediately whenever changes occur
- (6) A person entitled to the right of access conferred by this Act shall have the right to institute proceedings in the Court to compel any public institution to comply with the provisions of this section.
- (7) Public institutions are all authorities whether executive, legislative or judicial agencies, ministries, and extra-ministerial departments of the government, together with all the corporations established by law and all companies in which government has a controlling interest, and private companies utilizing public funds, providing public services or performing public functions.
- 3. An application for access for a record or information under this Act shall be made in accordance with Section 1 of this Act,

For the purpose of this Act, any information or record applied for under this Act that does not exist in print but can by regulation be produced from a machine, normally used by the government or public institution shall be deemed to be record under the control of the government or public institution.

Illiterate or disabled applicants who by virtue of their illiteracy or disability are unable to make an oral application for access to information or record in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) of this Section, may make that application through a third party.

An authorized official of a government or public institution to whom an applicant makes an oral application for information or record, shall reduce the application into writing in the manner prescribed under the subsection (1) of this Section and shall provide a copy of the written application to the applicant.

4. Where information is applied for under this Act the public institution to which the application is made shall, subject to sections 6, 7, and 8 of this Act, within 7 days after the application is received-

Make the information available to the applicant

Where the public institution considers that the application should be denied, the institution shall give written notice to the applicant that access to all or part of the information will not be granted, stating reasons for the denial, and the section of this Act under which the denial is made.

5. (1) Where a public institution receives an application for access to information, and the institution is of the view that another public institution has greater interest in the information, the institution to which the application is made

Many people who go on vacation wonder if their house will be safe while they are away. When you go on vacation, the last thing you want is a phone call telling you that your house was robbed- or even worse- coming back from vacation and discovering damage and loss. Here are some tips for securing your home.

Before you leave, check every door and window to make sure that everything is locked and sealed, including your garage door, shed, and basement windows. Also, make sure that you have no spare keys lying around that are "hidden" under a mat or under a rock. Burglars know where to look and a key gives them easy access. If you have a sliding window or door, put a piece of wood or a long metal rod on the track so that it can't be pushed open.

Set timers on lights outside of your house. The darker it is outside your house, the more appealing it is going to be for burglars because they cannot be seen. Also, timers help give the impression that someone is home.

Make sure that your newspapers and mail are picked up or put on hold. If papers and mail are piled up outside your house, it is obvious that someone has not been home for a while.

Leave some blinds or drapes open. If your house is completely closed off, it is going to look like no one is there. If you make it appear more normal, it is less obvious that you are away.

Arrange to have a trusted family member, neighbour or friend to check on your home. Even if it means having them going into the house to water the plants, they can take a peek around to make sure that everything is okay.

Going on a vacation is an excellent reminder to ensure you have an updated inventory of household goods which may include appliances, jewellery, firearms, and other valued

If you have any cash, jewellery, or any other valuables in your home, take them out and put them in a safety deposit box. It costs money for this service, but it is far better than if someone were to break into your home and find your valuables.

If you are a firearms owner, please ensure you secure and store all firearms in accordance with the Firearms Act and Regulations.

Set timers on electronics inside your house. Put one on a lamp or even a radio. If someone is watching your home and sees that there is no activity going on inside your house, it is a clear indicator that you are not home. Make sure that your home security system is on. Don't forget to tell your friend or family member the code so that they do not set off the alarm when they check on your home.
